Educating adults with dyslexia and promoting an inclusive culture of dyslexia by means of artistic and technological tools

The Project

A group of agencies in 5 different European countries are combining their efforts to network and share good practice in the field of dyslexia. The project will run over 2 years, during which time there will be networking meetings in all of the partner countries.

The project aims to promote a broader understanding of dyslexia within partner countries and to improve the awareness of the needs and rights of dyslexic people. The project group are considering a range of different mediums to achieve this; e.g. competitions, videos, and the development of additional promotional materials.

Improving the understanding of dyslexia means offering real opportunities to highlight inclusive mainstream strategies; thus empowering dyslexic learners and workers to achieve their potential.

Each partner country will have different experiences to share and a range of outcomes from the project depending on their local needs.

Objectives within the project

1. Network and share good practice
2. Encourage dyslexic individuals to share their experiences
3. Develop promotional materials
4. Share information about new supportive technology
5. Share information about policy and rights supporting those with dyslexia

Partner Meetings

There will be 4 partner meetings each year, each meeting will be hosted by a different partner country. The project is funded to accommodate a range of individuals attending these meetings. Ideally, partner organisations will be represented by a variety of individuals including dyslexic learners, specialist teachers, those involved in policy and providers of support technology.
